*Study Goals:* This project aims to collect pilot data to determine if a Heart Rate Variability (HRV) biofeedback behavioral training has efficacy in: (1) increasing tonic (resting state) HRV and decreasing gambling-related cravings, (2) improving phasic HRV (reactivity to stress) during exposure to gambling-cues and decreasing “in-the-moment” gambling-related craving, and (3) improving recovery from stress after exposure to gambling-related cues. Ethics approval and data collection is targeted to begin by Summer 2017.

2. ***Psychosocial Characteristic Predictors of Short- and Long-Term Treatment Outcomes among Patients in an Urban Methadone Clinic***

Data collection started in September 2016 and will finish ( $N = 150$  participants) by Spring/Summer 2018. Collection of one-year treatment outcome data will finish approximately one year later. At the end of Feb 2017, the study has enrolled 33 participants.
