Government data is “open” if anyone is free to use, modify, and share it, subject at most to measures that preserve provenance and openness. The City of Detroit has more than 150 open datasets on our Open Data Portal (ODP) at <https://data.detroitmi.gov/> and we’re always looking for exciting ways they can be put to good use.

That's where you come in!

Using our most popular datasets (for example [Fire Incidents](#) or [911 Calls for Service](#)), or others you find interesting, we want **YOU** to come up with original insights and data visualizations that say something new (or old, but interesting!) about Detroit. The deadline to submit is February 26th, 2023.

Here are the guidelines:

- Everyone is eligible to participate in this challenge, but you must use data contained in the Detroit Open Data Portal (other sources may be used in conjunction).
- Create your visualization(s) using the Open Data Portal itself, your preferred data visualization tool, or your preferred artistic medium. All pieces must be submitted as image files in a JPEG or PNG format. Be sure to cite your sources somewhere in the image.
- Submit your visualization(s) using [this form](#) (also available via QR code below).
- One entry will be selected by the Detroit Open Data Team for inclusion in our annual report, and the rest will be featured on the homepage throughout the year.
- If you need some help navigating the Open Data Portal, make sure to check the FAQ section on the ODP. If you have other questions not mentioned in there, send them to Djennin.Casab@detroitmi.gov and we’ll be happy to assist!
- Deadline to submit your creation is February 26th, 2023.
