Established in the legacy of Dr. Albert Schweitzer, the physician and humanitarian who left a comfortable existence to serve the health needs of people in Africa, the Schweitzer Fellowship challenges young people to leave their comfort zone and help communities overcome barriers that influence their health.

As a Schweitzer Fellow, you will acquire skills in creating intervention and prevention programs, and you will increase community capacity to address health needs. You will begin your professional career as an agent of change, confident and prepared to more effectively work with diverse and vulnerable people.

Upon completion of the Schweitzer Fellowship, you will be part of a national movement with more than 4,000 professionals who are pursuing their ideals and contributing to population health in America and elsewhere in the world.
