Keynote speaker **Kimberly Sue, MD, PhD** will discuss the relationship between mass incarceration and the U.S. "War on Drugs" declared by Nixon 50 years ago, how we as a society can improve the care of people who use drugs while avoiding incarceration, and posits harm reduction as a philosophy and practice as a potential strategy to address rising opioid overdose deaths in the United States.

Sue is a physician-anthropologist, author, and the Medical Director of the Harm Reduction Coalition, a national advocacy and capacity-building organization that promotes the health and dignity of individuals and communities impacted by drug use and the racialized War on Drugs.
