 - Social Workers as social entrepreneurs

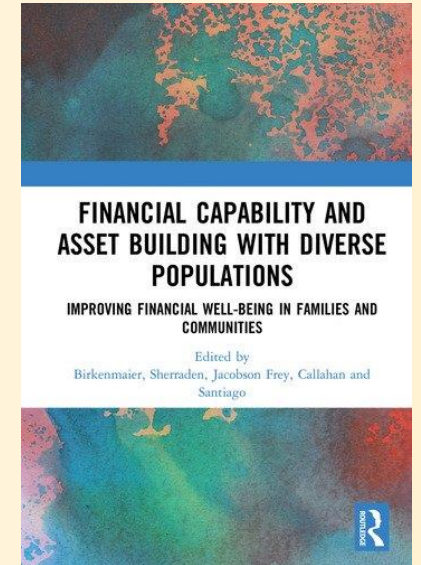
