You should call the Campus Health Center (CHC) at 313-577-5041 to notify them if you are experiencing symptoms or you have traveled internationally recently. The CHC is available 24/7 for assistance.

Your health and safety remain a priority for us. While you are on campus, please practice all of the social distancing and other precautionary measures prescribed by the CDC.
