What is YES-HR?

YES-HR is a prevention program designed to reduce sexual and teen dating violence among middle school youth through youth empowerment, positive youth development, and community-level change

What is the study?

The study, now in its fourth and final year, involves collection of survey data from middle and high school youth. Data collection events will occur during the school day from mid-April through early June.

Tasks include:

- Administering surveys
- Miscellaneous items (mailings, tracking youth participants, etc.)

Applicants must...

- Be a currently enrolled student
- Provide their own transportation to several different high schools in Wayne County, as well as the WSU campus
- Pass a background check conducted by WSU
- Complete data collection protocol and human subjects research training before work can begin
